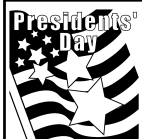

Pastor's Corner

I was hoping to return to the subject of Mass and to continue to address those reasons some people have expressed for not attending Mass each Sunday. However, the ongoing controversy in the news concerning the President and primarily the Catholic Church necessitates some clarification.

On January 20th, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) reaffirmed its mandate that virtually all private health care plans must cover sterilization, abortifacients, and contraception. This ruling affects people of all faiths, but especially the Catholic Church, which has a long history of ministering to people of all faiths in its schools, hospitals, charities, etc. as part of its mission. The decision by HHS under the current administration has put the Catholic Church between a rock and a hard place. If it gives in and provides this coverage it will violate its core teachings and cease to be Catholic. If it fails to comply it will be hit with astronomical penalties that would force it to give up its mission to others, especially the poor.

HHS has made the exemption so narrow that it would only apply to those religions that hire from and minister to people of their own faith. In clear violation of the First Amendment of the Bill of Rights, which guarantees the free exercise of religion, the federal government, in essence, has taken upon itself to decide what constitutes religious activity for a given faith tradition. The secularists who are pushing this mandate want to force the Catholic Church and all religions out of the public square and into the narrow confines of their church or temple walls.

Faced with a backlash that united Catholics of all stripes, along with people of other religions, the President made an "accommodation" to religious institutions. What he did was shift where the coverage for these illicit practices originates; the insurance company and not the religious institute would be responsible for providing this coverage. However, there would be no rider to the plan and no increased fees for a person requesting such coverage. This means the employer (the religious institute) is still responsible for paying for this objectionable coverage and, in the case of "free contraception", every one of us will be forced to offset these costs, which will be reflected in the employee contribution to any such plan. Also, there are Catholic religious institutions, such as the Christian Brothers, that provide insurance and they would receive no exemption. After reviewing the revised proposal by the President, it is no surprise that our Bishops and other faith leaders have rejected this "compromise."

It has been disappointing to watch how this story has been portrayed in the media, which has focused its attention on the question of contraception obscuring both the moral and religious freedom issues. They seem to want to turn the controversy into a referendum on birth control implying the Catholic Church wants to impose its beliefs on the rest of the nation. This is simply not true. The Catholic Church wants this needless government intrusion in the internal governance of religious institutions to cease and to respect the moral conscience of believers.

The Catholics bishops have long supported access to healthcare for all, but they balked at the President's proposal for universal healthcare because as it stood it did not respect the conscience rights of individuals and religious institutions. In opposition to their bishops, some Catholic organizations supported the President's healthcare initiative believing him when he said he would respect the conscience rights of all. These same organizations are now accepting the President's "accommodation" to religious institutions, but they are once again deceiving themselves.

Inserted in the bulletin is a statement by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, which asks all the faithful to pray and work for the establishment of laws to protect the consciences of all. It is vital that we protect our First Amendment rights so as to worship freely and in accordance with the norms established by Christ and His Church.
