## Pastor's Corner

A few weeks back I spoke of the relativism so prevalent in our society today and why it is one of the leading causes of the decline in Church attendance over the past fifty years. When each individual determines what is right and wrong it leads to disunity in society and from a moral perspective it leads to spiritual chaos. It is this relativism that has led to a crisis in truth; many people today no longer believe in objective truth.

This crisis in truth is behind the crisis of faith so evident in the industrialized West. If there are no objective truths then how can someone be certain that the Bible is the living word of God or believe in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist or believe the Christian revelation of the Trinity? These are three difficulties some people have expressed and are behind their reasons for not attending Mass each Sunday.

As human beings each one of us has to make a decision about God, no one can remain neutral on this fundamental question. Prior to his elevation to the Papacy, Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger wrote in *Introduction to Christianity*, that three main paths have been taken in human history on the question of God: monotheism, polytheism and atheism. In traditional religions the response has been polytheistic; monotheism was given to the world through God's revelation to the people of Israel. Judaism, Christianity and Islam have different understandings of God but each professes its belief in one God. The response of atheism began to develop with the "Enlightenment" but it was not until the mid-twentieth century that atheism had any significant number of adherents.

No one can prove or disprove the existence of God but the decision we make about God effects how we understand the world and our role in it. Atheism takes for granted that the world was always present and we are just some accident of nature destined to die and be no more. It is easy to see how this world view leads to individualism, relativism and a lack of meaning in life.

Our Christian understanding of God tells us that God created the heavens and the earth and everything in them including us human beings, who have been made in the image of God. We have been created by God, who loves us and we respond by striving to know God, so we can love and serve God. It is God who gives meaning to both our lives and our world. We have come from God and we are meant to return to God through our lives lived in accordance with His will. It is God who is the source and ground of all truth; relativism is incompatible with our belief in God.

Given our belief in God, I will address the three stumbling blocks listed above in my next discussion on some of the reasons why people are not attending Mass on Sundays. In the meantime enjoy the game and hopefully the Patriots will win this time.

***SUICIDE IS ALWAYS A TRAGEDY***

Next week, February 11, is the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes. Every year since 1992, the Catholic Church celebrates World Day of the Sick on this feast of Our Lady. Pope John Paul II wanted this day to be an occasion to reflect upon the mystery of suffering, to become more aware of our sick brothers and sisters, and to honor doctors, nurses and all who practice the healing arts. This coming November, people in Massachusetts will be faced with a ballot initiative that, if passed, will de-criminalize doctor-prescribed suicide in our Commonwealth. Those who support this petition say that it will provide compassionate care for the terminally and incurably ill. Intentionally causing a person to die, or providing a person the means to take his own life, is not compassion nor is it an expression of care and concern, even if they ask us to do it.

Next week, we hear a pre-recorded homily from His Eminence, Cardinal Seán O'Malley on assisted suicide and the dangers that it poses should it become legal in our state. He will talk about the fact that, as Catholics, we have the responsibility to defend the principle that each of us has the right to live each day until the time we are called to eternal life. We will receive prayer cards, brochures and other materials to help us to evangelize ourselves and others about end-of-life care. The Monthly Prayer Request for Priests (MPRP) is an international apostolate which was founded in 1990 to encourage people to support Catholic priests by prayer and sacrifice. Each diocese prays for its own priests. Each day of the year bears the name of a priest from that diocese, obtained from the diocesan directory. Thus, by means of a calendar, the faithful are united in offering prayer and sacrifice for the particular "priest of the day," always remembering to include a general intention of prayer for all priests of the diocese and around the world.
