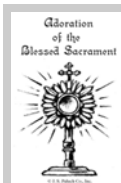

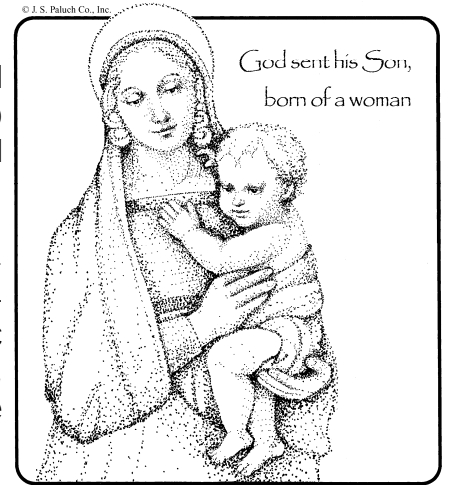

## Pastor's Corner

Today marks the start of a new year with all its hopes and promises, as well as the unexpected challenges we will face as families and as a nation. We also celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God as we give honor to our Blessed Mother for accepting God's invitation to conceive and bear Jesus, the Christ.

On December 8<sup>th</sup> we celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception; another feast in honor of Mary, who was conceived in the normal way but without sin by means of a prevenient or anticipated grace deriving from Christ's salvific act. By itself this special privilege of Mary's was not enough to keep her from sin, like us she had to decide to choose God's will at every moment of every day. Unlike us she did this perfectly.



Mary remained sinless because of her profound union with God, which was a fruit of her prayer life and her fidelity to God's covenant with Israel. She was faithful to all the prescriptions of the law including the importance of keeping holy the Sabbath. It was this daily union with God that prepared her to accept the words of the angel Gabriel and make her *fiat*, "Let it be done to me according to your word." (Lk. 1: 38b) In our desire to respond to God's love for us we too take time each day to pray and open our hearts to the saving grace God makes available to us each day, but especially during Mass, which we attend each week (or daily if possible).

Families that pray together understand how necessary prayer is in strengthening their particular family giving credence to the axiom of Fr. Patrick Peyton: "Families that pray together stay together." He advocated the family rosary as one of the best means to unite and strengthen families. In his day he took for granted that families would attend Mass each week, preferably together when ever possible. It is this faithful witness of parents, the first and best teachers of their children in the ways of faith, which builds a solid foundation of faith for their children.

Along with our desire to strengthen our particular family and to pass on the faith to our children and grandchildren, we participate each week at Mass in order to be transformed by Christ's sacramental grace. As true God and true Man, Jesus perfectly lived out His humanity. The closer we become conformed to Christ the more fully human we become. We are able to realize our baptismal grace and become children of God or as Matthew Kelly put it, "To become the best version of ourselves."

Attending Mass each week also allows us to participate in Jesus' victory over death and the salvation He won for us. The Mass is the memorial of Jesus' saving Passion, Resurrection and Ascension into heaven, which is why every Sunday is considered a "little Easter." Through our participation in this Paschal Mystery we have a foretaste of heaven and a pledge of future glory. Fidelity to Mass each week, along with regular sacramental Confession throughout the year provides the surest path to the eternal life each one of us desires. It is no wonder God, in His wisdom, gave us the Third Commandment to keep holy the Sabbath, which is fulfilled by Christians when we keep holy the Lord's Day.

The Mass is Christ's gift to us and it the means He established to make visible His lasting presence among us. As we start this New Year let us look to Mary as the model disciple and recommit ourselves to full and active participation at Mass. As we faithfully enter into this Sacred Mystery may we be enabled to set out and bear witness to so great a gift and invite others to the fullness of our Catholic faith.
