Pastor's Corner

In recent weeks we have been talking about why Catholics attend Sunday Mass and make it an important part of their faith lives. As stated previously, it was Jesus Christ who instituted the Mass giving us the gift of Himself in the Eucharist at the Last Supper when He also instituted the priesthood. Furthermore, the Mass is rooted in the Old Testament and the instructions on worship that Moses received from God. This is why Pope Benedict in his *"The Spirit of the Liturgy"* said the Eucharistic Liturgy was established by God and it is the way God wants us to worship Him.

When we look at these reasons for attending Mass we notice immediately that they are taken from the divine perspective, not a human perspective. This divine perspective is in conflict with the relativism so prevalent in our society. Relativism has grown in prominence in our country over the last 100 years, but especially over the past fifty years. Relativism stems from an atheistic or agnostic perspective which denies God. Without God there are no absolute truths and everything becomes relative based on each individual. Sadly, this is the reality of our society today.

A society that embraces relativism, which is now dominant in the western world, is headed toward anarchy, which is the only conclusion possible. Anarchy is the complete absence of government leading to political disorder, lawlessness and violence. We had a taste of it this fall with the "occupy movements". These demonstrations were carried out not only in the U.S. but throughout the industrialized world. When every thing becomes relative there is little that can unite a society.

Just as relativism in society creates political disorder, moral relativism leads to spiritual chaos. It is easy to understand an atheist being his own authority as to what is morally right or wrong, but it is difficult for a believer to hold such views. Eventually he will give up relativism or he will give up his belief in God. Sadly, the faith of many former Catholics has been undone by moral relativism. Moral relativism is one of the leading causes for the dramatic drop in Church attendance over the past fifty years.

This temptation of our first parents is a temptation for every age. In Genesis the devil says to Eve: "You will not die. For God knows that when you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." (3: 4b-5) All those who have embraced relativism have given into this temptation and have made a god of themselves as they choose for themselves what is morally right and wrong. Before these separated Catholics will be willing to come to Mass they have to undergo a major conversion and give up their relativistic worldview and embrace our Catholic worldview.

The best thing to do for someone you know who has embraced relativism is to pray for that person, but also show the inconsistencies in his or her worldview and the disunity and emptiness it leads to. The way in which you live and embrace your faith can help them to see the beauty of a life in Christ flowing from our communion with Him at Mass.
