Pastor's Corner

Ten years ago I was living in the Philippines ministering to the poor and providing formation for our seminarian students preparing for ordination to the priesthood when disturbing news began to appear in the local newspapers concerning priests in the U.S. The news itself was shocking but it was even more troubling when I found out these stories were originating in the Archdiocese of Boston. It was hard to believe for it was not my experience growing up in this archdiocese, where I had met and known many fine priests. Sadly, many of the stories were true as I would find out later that summer when I returned to the U.S.

This weekend marks the tenth anniversary of the sexual abuse scandal and it is a painful reminder of this dark chapter in both the Church of Boston and the U.S. As difficult as this was to endure it was a blessing that the Boston Globe broke this story. First, it is hoped that the victims and their families have received justice and are experiencing healing in their lives. We all continue to pray for them. Second, those priests who betrayed the sacred trust placed in them have been removed and laicized and in some cases incarcerated. Third, bishops have learned the necessity of being transparent in their actions. Fourth, the faith of all of us who have weathered this storm has been strengthened and it is on this faith that Our Lord is rebuilding His Church.

In the summer of 2003 Bishop Sean O'Malley was installed as Archbishop of Boston and was given the task of rebuilding the Church of Boston, which was badly damaged due to the crisis. At his installation he asked the priests and laity alike to help him in this work of rebuilding the Church. He then set out in humility and prayer and began to undertake this monumental task. Little by little he began to regain the trust of his priests and his people, who have contributed to this rebuilding effort, which is slowly bearing fruit.

There is still much work that needs to be done. The bond of trust between the bishops and their priests and people has been seriously weakened and needs to be strengthened. The same can be said regarding priests and their people. Although anger was justified initially, many people have continued to hold on to their anger against the clergy and the Church. It is kept just below the surface and it is always ready to erupt given the right circumstances. This is not healthy for the individual or for the Church because anger is like a cancer that destroys people and relationships. The remedy for this anger is Christ, Himself. We must give our anger over to Christ and allow Him to heal us and replace it with a spirit of mercy and forgiveness.

We have to be free of this anger so we can take on the much needed work of evangelization, an essential aspect of rebuilding the Church. The Church by her very nature is missionary; you and I have been called to evangelize by virtue of our Baptism. This begins with our family and friends and expands from there. It also includes our culture, which has incorporated many values contrary to the Gospel. Our society needs the light of Christ and the truth He bore witness to in order to be life giving as God intended.

This Sunday marks a sad anniversary in our Church, but this Sunday also is the Epiphany, the manifestation of Christ to the nations symbolized in the Magi. It reminds us that Christ is the true king of our world and He is leading it to its ultimate fulfillment. When we look to Christ we know all is well. We have to trust in His goodness and His power to transform us and our world. We only need to be faithful to our call and Christ will take care of the rest.

The **Rosary** is said every weekday morning after the 7:30 am Mass and also on Saturday after the 8:15 am Mass. On the First Saturday of every month after the 8:15 am Mass, the rosary is said in honor of Our Lady of Fatima.
