Pastor's Corner

During the Octave of Easter the cover of Time Magazine asked the question, "What if there's no HELL?"¹ Normally I would not waste my time with such an article, but this one has the potential to sow confusion in the hearts and minds of the faithful and unfaithful alike.

What prompted this article was a book entitled, "Love Wins: A Book About Heaven, Hell, and the Fate of Every Person Who Ever Lived", written by Rob Bell, Evangelical Pastor of the mega church Mars Hill Bible Church in Michigan. The whole presentation on salvation, heaven and hell is taken from an Evangelical-Christian perspective. Bell was inspired to write this book after reflecting on what happens to those people who die and have not taken Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

If you have ever been approached by an evangelical "preacher" in the airport or elsewhere you would have been asked if you have taken Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior. For them it is pretty cut and dry, one either professes Jesus as Lord and Savior or denies it. Those who believe in Jesus will be saved and those who do not will perish. There are other nuances too, such as being part of the "right" Church. So if you responded to this "preacher" by saying I am a Catholic and yes I believe in Jesus as my Lord and Savior. He would respond that you are going to hell because you are an idolater, who worships Mary and the saints. The Evangelicals tend to have an exclusive view of salvation.

Pastor Bell upset the evangelical world by proposing that the redemptive work of Jesus was universal, that Jesus came to save every person who ever lived. So someone like Mohandas Gandhi, who never accepted Jesus as his Lord and Savior, could be in heaven. This is a seismic shift in the evangelical worldview and it is understandable why Bell has ignited a major controversy among Evangelicals.

The Reformed Churches share many of the same beliefs as the Catholic Church and there is more that unites us than divides us. However, there are real differences in theology and this question of salvation highlights one of those differences with Evangelicals. As Catholics we believe Jesus sacrificed Himself on the Cross for all people, that is, the redemption He won is universal and it excludes no one. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says it well: "The Church, following the apostles, teaches that Christ died for all men without exception: 'There is not, never has been, and never will be a single human being for whom Christ did not suffer.'" (CCC #605)

The means of salvation Christ chose for our world is the Church He founded on Peter and the Apostles, that Church is the Catholic Church. "As sacrament, the Church is Christ's instrument. She is taken up by Him also as the instrument for the salvation of all, the universal sacrament of salvation, by which Christ is at once manifesting and actualizing the mystery of God's love for men." (CCC #776) Through the Church, in ways known only to God, Christ is making possible the salvation of all people, but this does not mean that all people will be saved.

We will continue this discussion next week taking up the question of the existence of hell.

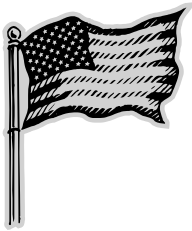
